What are the job duties of a Nursing Assistant?

Nursing assistants have many responsibilities including taking patients' vital signs, feeding, bathing, and dressing patients, changing bed linens, and more.

Where are Nursing Assistants employed?

Usually Nursing Assistants are employed in medical facilities, such as hospitals, rehabilitation centers, and nursing homes, they work under the supervision of either a licensed practical nurse (LPN) or a registered nurse (RN).

What is the pay scale?

Anywhere from \$12- \$15 dollars/hour

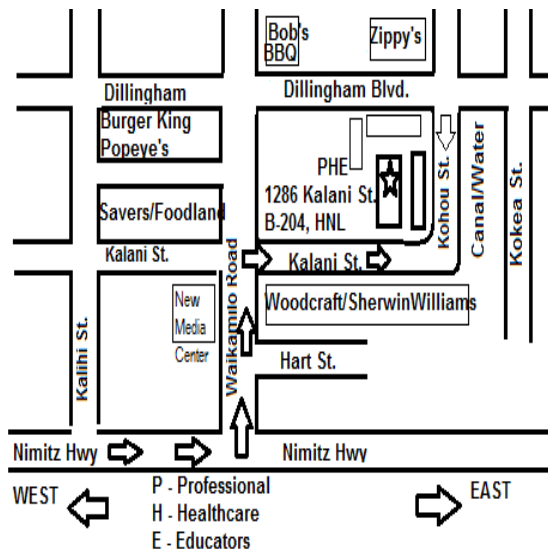
Is there a demand for Nursing Assistants?

The job growth for CNAs is faster than average, with an expected growth of 21% or more by 2014. A total of more than 500,000 more additional employees will be needed. There are excellent employment opportunities for CNAs across the nation.

Is there opportunity for career advancement?

With increased training CNAs most often choose to advance to careers such as Medical Assistants, Licensed Vocational Nurses, Licensed Practical Nurses, or Registered Nurses. .

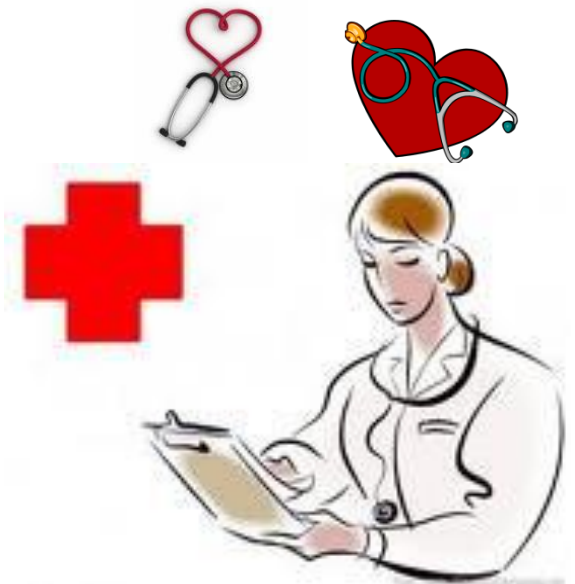

CERTIFIED NURSE ASSISTANT

HOW TO BECOME A CERTIFIED NURSE ASSISTANT?

This program is designed to provide you with the skills necessary to meet the physical, physiological, and psychological needs of the acute, chronic, or long-term patient within a hospital or long-term care facility. The curriculum includes an overall introduction to human relations, anatomy, physiology, and bacteriology as well as body mechanics, disease processes and the therapeutic approaches used to arrest or contain them. Universal precautions are taught throughout the program and emphasis is placed on the need to protect the patient as well as the nursing assistant. You will spend classroom time with hands-on clinical practice, multimedia, lab/skills practice and individualized instruction. If you are looking for a traditional lecture format, you may find this learning environment not only empowering, but challenging. Instructors will work with you individually to facilitate your unique learning style.



CPR/First Aid Class: Gain knowledge and skills necessary to prevent, recognize, and provide basic care for injuries and sudden illnesses until advanced medical personnel arrive and take over. This course covers First Aid, Adult CPR, and use of an Automated External Defibrillator, or AED. Training meets OSHA First Aid Guidelines and Emergency Cardiovascular Care 2000 Guidelines. Written exams provide documentation and measure learning, so instructors can review topics when necessary to ensure thorough training.

Focuses on typical Automated External Defibrillator (AED) equipment, this course features hands-on simulation, lectures, and live and video demonstrations.

American Red Cross First Aid and Safety curriculum and books are used. Course requires active participation, successful ability to pass written exam and perform various skills. Cost of class comprises of class materials, supplies, and course completion card.

There are different courses that are available to suit your needs. Adult CPR/First Aid classes take about 5-6 hours.



Requirements: Nurse Assistant

- Must be 18yrs and above
- High School graduate or equivalent
- TB clearance
- Physical Exam
- Criminal Background Check

UNIFORMS

Students are required to wear white, colored or print scrub uniforms and white shoes (clean, white tennis shoes may be worn) on all classroom and clinical days. Crocks are not acceptable
